MEDAC TO FURTHER IMPROVE ITS DELIVERY SYSTEM AND PROCESSES TO ENHANCE SMES AND EMPOWER SMALL AND INFORMAL BUSINESSES

Putrajaya, 31 December 2020 – As it enters the new year of 2021, The Ministry of Entrepreneur Development and Cooperatives (MEDAC) will continue to focus on improving its processes and delivery system in its quest to further enhance performance of Malaysia’s SME sector and empower small businesses and informal businesses – enabling them to adapt to the post COVID-19 new norm.

Minister Dato Sri Dr Wan Junaidi Tuanku Jaafar said although he is happy with the overall performance of MEDAC and its agencies in 2020, there is still room for more improvements, particularly in simplifying processes and reducing red tapes.

In retrospect, due to the restricted movement following the Movement Control Order (MCO), Dr Wan Junaidi said the year 2020 should be a time for us to self-reflect, a time to rethink our strategy and future direction.

In line with this, in the spirit of the new year, he called on entrepreneurs to be ready to get out of your comfort zone and adapt to a new business environment in order to cushion the impact of the pandemic on the country’s economic activities.

“MEDAC and its agencies have various incentives, programs, assistance and facilities that entrepreneurs can take advantage of in an effort to familiarize themselves with the new norms of the post-COVID-19 era.
